Description

The economic and political impacts of the Arab uprisings continue after ten years. Although a smooth transition has taken place in countries such as Tunisia, Morocco and Jordan, the civil war in Yemen and Syria has been going on for ten years. It is unclear to what extent the expected reforms can be realized during this period after the popular upheavals, in which political freedoms and economic demands stand out. In this book, it is aimed to discuss the experiences of the Middle East countries after the Arab uprisings, to evaluate the economic and social developments and to suggest economic and political reform agendas for the ongoing conflicts.

He is currently working as an assistant professor at Kırklareli University, where his primary fields of interest include institutional economics and political economy of the Middle East.
