Description:

The aims and objectives of this volume include the following:

- To identify the ways in which technology can facilitate innovation in the post-COVID era, during which the use of digital payment platforms which embrace the use of central bank digital currencies (CBDCs) and distributed ledger technologies has increased in terms of volume and importance;
- To highlight the role of regulation in regulating such innovative technologies;
- To illustrate how key actors, such as central banks, can facilitate the transition process to a net-zero based carbon emissions phase. Should central banks be held responsible for risks relating to climate change?
- To illustrate how innovative techniques and technology can interact with such concepts as green finance to facilitate a smooth transition to a net-zero carbon emissions economy;
- To highlight challenges which may be encountered during the transition process, and how to address such risks;
- To highlight how the role of private and public sector engagement can be enhanced through Fintech innovation.

What Should the Submitted Chapters Consider?

Submissions are welcomed on (although not exclusively restricted to) the following topics:

- Sensor technologies—as well as those technologies which can facilitate a smooth gradual transition to a net-zero carbon emissions economy;
- Green finance;
- Central bank digital currencies, particularly retail-based CBDCs and wholesale CBDCs;
- Fintech;
- Digital payments in the post-COVID era (embracing wholesale and retail CBDCs, as well as other technological platforms);
- The role of central banks, technological innovation, and tech firms in addressing transition risks and enhancing sustainable growth;
- The feasibility of achieving a net zero based carbon emissions economy;



- The role of renewable energy in the path towards a sustainable future.

Submission Requirements:

All chapters submitted should conform to the grammar and formatting guidelines provided by Cambridge Scholars Publishing, which can be viewed here: <https://www.cambridgescholars.com/pages/forms-guidelines>.

Unless agreed with the Editor prior to submission, referencing should be in Chicago style.

Any work submitted for publication should be free of copyright restrictions, and a statement should be submitted in support of this.

Contributions should be scholarly based, rather than anecdotal or unverifiable.

Ideally, contributions should be wholly in English, excluding footnotes, appendices, and short extracts for translation. However, submissions in other languages can be considered, provided that the amount of non-English text does not exceed 10%.

While we will perform pre-press evaluations on the collection, we ask that works are submitted to us in their final, 'ready-to-go' form.

How to Submit?

You should submit to the Editor a completed proposal form, alongside a copy of your work for their review. All submissions and related enquiries should be directed to theeditor@ciinnovationsd.org (with the subject line "Submissions").

If you have any questions about the collection, prior to your submission, please contact the Editor.

Timeline:

Invitation of proposals: 2nd August 2021 – 31st July, 2022

Notification of accepted proposals: 15th August, 2022

Deadline for chapter submissions: 31st October, 2022

Notification of accepted papers: 30th November, 2022



Deadline for submission of revised papers: 30th December, 2023

All works should be submitted to the Editor, at the address provided at the top of this document.

The Editor will review these personally to consider their inclusion in the work. Should the Editor approve the chapters, you will then be asked to complete an agreement for the publication of these chapters. **It is essential that this agreement is completed in order for your work to be printed.**

Once the Editor has approved the chapter, and has received your contributor agreement, these will then be sent to Cambridge Scholars as a complete collection for pre-press reviews and publication. **As such, it is essential that the work you submit to the Editor is finalised. The Editor, Rianne Ola Ojo, will also provide extended proofreading services, where required.**
